Paper 2 Task Two

Our course encompasses 4O years of US History, from 1955-1992. We will be studying changes in American society, politics, economy and culture. To help us to place each change in context, you need to create a timeline, detailing every Presidential Election between 1950 and 1992- when it took place, who became President a result, and which political party they represented. This will be kept at the front of your folder to be used as reference point throughout the course. You should also include a picture of each president and note anything interesting or significant about the election campaign or result.
